5th Osnabrück Symposium on Good Scientific Practice

On October 5th and 6th, 2022, Osnabrück University is holding its fifth symposium on good scientific practice. All doctoral candidates and postdocs, all professors, lecturers and students at Osnabrück University are cordially invited to participate.

The conference will focus on the following questions:

- What is "good science"? What rules of good scientific practice must be observed when dealing with data and sources and when publishing research results?
- What is scientific misconduct? Where are the boundaries between scientific misconduct, technical errors and questionable scientific practice?
- What can I do if I suspect someone of scientific misconduct?

The symposium will start on October 5th with an introductory lecture on the new Code of Conduct of the German Research Foundation (DFG) "Guidelines for Safeguarding Good Scientific Practice". On October 6th three parallel workshops for postdocs, doctoral candidates, and advanced master's students are planned to address issues of implementing good scientific practice in the everyday research of different disciplinary cultures. Among others, the topics "Handling data and sources" and "Publication process and authorship" will be examined in more detail.

Language

The conference language is mainly German. A handout in English will be provided for the introductory lecture. The handout will be available online on October 5th at www.uni-osnabrueck.de/zepros.
